



## **DIVERSITY AMONG ARTWORKS**



The Central Bank Museums took a considerable risk with one of their latest expositions which was the one called Almost Invisible. The risk was with respect to the time frame of the show being from March to September. That was a long time to occupy one of the most respected art spaces in San José, not to mention one of the biggest magnets for foreign tourists.

Visitors considered many of the exhibited artworks remarkably modern. One of those works was Cecilia Paredes' piece of art which is called Dreaming Rose. Visitors concluded that the most extraordinary painting was Song by the Seashore, in which two male figures are painted in the flattened and colorful style of Romare Bearden; the image is powerfully Afro-Caribbean in nature.

As a matter of fact, the main purpose of <u>Almost Invisible</u> was to show just how diverse Costa Rican artworks are, and how broad their expression can be.

## GOOD APPETITE!

Strange names of Costa Rican dishes can confuse foreigners, yet they may feel satisfied when tasting the specific flavor of traditional or typical food at restaurants where this simple and tasty food is served at low prices. Foreigners should also know that sodas offer home cooking at incredible low prices, too.



Costa Rica's most treasured culinary delight is the tamal. For Christmas, tamal making is a family tradition. The tamal is seasoned cornmeal stuffed with chopped pork, chicken or beef, and chopped vegetables, raisins, prunes or olives. The tamal is wrapped in banana leaves and finally boiled.

As it was mentioned above, traditional food is simple and tasty. Beans and rice, vegetables plus chicken, meat or fish are a part of the main meals in Costa Rica. Fresh coriander and garlic add flavor to traditional food, but sometimes people avoid hot spices and sauces. For an extra flavor, some Ticos add a little of hot chilero to their food; similarly, some Ticos add Tabasco. In fact, both products give a delicious taste to different dishes.

#### **ALL-AMERICAN BURGER**

## INGREDIENTS:

1/2 teaspoon of Worcestershire sauce

1/4 teaspoon of ground black pepper

1 large onion, sliced in rings

4 slices of Cheddar cheese

1½ pounds of ground beef

4 sesame seed buns

1 large tomato, sliced

4 pickled cucumbers

1/4 teaspoon of salt

4 lettuce leaves

1 large egg



## PREPARATION:

- First, mix the meat (ground beef), salt, pepper, Worcestershire sauce.
   and the egg to form the patties (pieces of food made into a disc shape)
   in a medium bowl.
- Second, in a large skillet, cook patties (for about 4 to 5 minutes) over high heat flipping it over once midway through.
- Third, place one slice of cheese on top of each patty and cook for one minute longer.
- Fourth, remove the patties from the skillet and place them on a wire rack.
- Fifth, reduce the heat to medium, add the onions, and cook until golden brown (for 6 minutes).
- · Sixth, remove the skillet from the heat.
- Then, on the bottom half of each sesame seed bun, place one patty, tomato, lettuce, pickles, and onion rings.
- Next, cover with the top of the bun.
- Finally, serve the burger with ketchup and French Fries.

# **BOXING DAY**



The day after Christmas Day is a traditional holiday which is commonly known as Boxing Day. It takes its name because household servants and tradesmen would receive small gifts (known as Christmas boxes) from their bosses or employers for their work throughout the year.

Boxing Day is celebrated in some countries such as the United Kingdom, Canada, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Malta and other nations in different ways. For example, in Ireland, this holiday is called Wren Day because of a story in which a wren (a local bird) was killed. So children go door-to-door asking for money in exchange for a wren feather which people believe that brings good luck.

Another example is the Australians' celebration. There people go shopping, and business people celebrate a kind of Black Friday. Boxing Day is a federal public holiday. In South Africa, Boxing Day was renamed the Day of Goodwill in 1994. Besides, in some European countries such as Germany, Poland, Scandinavia and the Netherlands, December 26 is celebrated as the second Christmas Day. During this holiday, families get together, visit friends and go to parties.

# **TURTLE WATCHING AND CONSERVATION**

For tourists, turtle births have become a spectator sport or hobby in Costa Rica. Recent statistics have shown that the attention and money that small groups of tourists direct towards turtles are invaluable in efforts to stabilize turtle populations. The peculiar beauty of the experience cannot be compared to anything else.



Nonetheless, turtle watching is an activity that must be strongly regulated. It also requires the highest respect and protection of new-born turtles from tourists. It is necessary to go with an experienced guide and follow all the instructions carefully. People should report any misbehavior by guides or tourists to the National Park officers.

In Costa Rica, turtles nest on both coasts, and at most times of the year, people can see at least one nest. For example, visitors can easily see the giant Leatherback turtles in Las Baulas National Marine Park at Playa Grande in Guanacaste. They nest from October to March.

Another option is to see the smallest <u>Olive Ridley</u> turtle nests in Ostional <u>Wildlife Refuge</u> in great numbers. In fact, Tortuguero National Park on the Caribbean coast is the last remaining massive nesting spot for the Green turtle. They nest from July to October along the long beach, and the baby turtles emerge at sunrise two months later.

The back is the support of the human body. This makes it susceptible to injury, resulting in back pain that can be quite immobilizing. There are many reasons for back pain suffering. For example, specialists have identified falls, bad posture or even osteoporosis as some of the root causes. These problems could result in a herniated disk or sciatic nerve pain.

Back pain relief exercises usually help most patients. One of the best exercises recommended for back problems is yoga by learning how to stretch and bend. Then, to get the most from the required postures, one should meet a physical therapist specializing in yoga. Essentially, yoga increases the skeletal and muscle strength of the back while correcting back problems. Back pain relief exercises are also accompanied by physical therapy treatment like massages, the application of heat or ice, and electrical stimulation.

Besides, a good way to prevent back pain is the right consumption of a calcium and protein-based diet which is often the basis of a strong back. Along with this, it is essential to wear shoes with the right heel height; stilettos (shoes with a very high narrow heel) are one of the major causes of back injury. Finally, specialists say that people must avoid lifting heavy objects such as chairs, desks and others in the wrong way.

#### THE DEMOCRATIC HISTORY OF A COUNTRY



Although Costa Ricans have enjoyed the benefits of <u>political</u> stability and peace, there have been some periods of violence in the last hundred years. For instance, from <u>1917</u> to 1919, Federico Tinoco Granados was overthrown and forced into exile.

Besides, in 1948, José Figueres Ferrer led a disputed presidential election that ended up in an armed uprising. This sad event led to 2000 deaths and a forty-four-day civil war which was the first and worse political disruptive situation in Costa Rica in the twentieth century. This event also led the victorious government to abolish the military in 1949. Moreover, the new government drafted a new constitution with a democratically-elected assembly. Then, the new Costa Rican government, established by the assembly, held their first democratic election under the new constitution in 1953, when they elected José Figueres Ferrer.

During the following years, Costa Rica has enjoyed peaceful democratic elections and pacific transitions of power. The stability of governments has benefited Costa Ricans in many ways. For example, Costa Rica has consistently been near the top of Latin American countries in the Human Development Index. Costa Rica also ranks first in the Americas in terms of the Environmental Performance Index; and at the same time, national governments have announced plans for Costa Rica to become the first carbon neutral country by 2021.

#### THE FUTURE OF DRONES



The photographer, Raphael Pirker, needed overhead shots for a commercial. Then, he attached a camera to a 2.3 kilograms model airplane, creating a *drone* (robot vehicle) to capture high-flying aerial views. A year earlier, he piloted a similar drone around the Statue of Liberty in the United States.

Technology has advanced a lot, so it has created smaller and more accessible drones. The potential applications of drones are extending far beyond their use. For example, Amazon's founder Jeff Bezos has introduced drones to deliver goods to online shoppers. Another example is when people need to search and carry out rescue operations using microdrone-UAS. The microdrone carbon fiber housing allows the aerial platforms to operate successfully under rain or snow and at extreme temperatures as in the case of fires.

As a matter of fact, with data transferred to a base station taking place in real time, it is not necessary for firefighters or support personnel to enter the danger zone to analyze the situation because microdrones-UAV canfulfill this role. By using a gas measurement device, for example, the smoke composition of a fire can be communicated, so that firefighting teams are aware of it. A thermal image camera can assist in searches for missing people, by identifying people in forests.



#### **NECESSITY TO COMMUNICATE**



Since the beginning of time, man has felt the necessity to communicate his feelings, basic needs and ideas to others. Language has been involved as an answer to this need. Nevertheless, oral language itself was not enough.

Like many African tribes today, primitive groups of people communicated at the beginning by beating sticks against resonant logs and tree trunks. Smoke signaling was also a favorite means of early communication, not only among the American Indians, as we tend to believe, but also among the ancient Chinese, Egyptians, and Greeks.

Some means of communication were invented in the <u>United States</u> (the U.S.). For example, the telegraph was invented in 1844 by <u>Samuel Morse</u>. After this important device, the telephone was invented by Alexander <u>Graham Bell in Boston on March 10, 1876</u>. In the same way, the first radio program was broadcasted on Christmas Eve in <u>1906</u> in <u>Massachusetts</u>.

Currently, man has developed numerous sophisticated modes of optical and electromagnetic communication. In fact, many communication devices have been invented, but the need, that originated all of them and probably the future ones, is still the same which is to transmit feelings and ideas to others.
