#### WHERE TO GO SCUBA DIVING

Less than a decade ago, Costa Rica was virtually unknown as a diving destination. Suddenly, it was discovered for its variety of marine wildlife. Then, new facilities along the Pacific coastline started offering first-class dive boats and fully stocked dive shops. Now, divers have the excitement of truly virgin diving in areas never explored before.

The most recent dive-site development has been along the Pacific coast of the Guanacaste province. Here, people can see a huge variety of fish, soft corals and invertebrates as a result of the abundance of plankton that grows in this tropical area. It makes the country a perfect place to practice diving during the summer. However, visibility can often be obscured especially during the rainy season from May to November. The best places on this side of the country are Murciélago Islands and the Catalinas Islands. Cocos Island is also another great place in the Pacific for scuba diving. It is famous for its wonderful wildlife featuring big encounters with whale sharks, hammerheads and mantas. The Caribbean coast has yet to develop a serious infrastructure catering to



sports divers, despite good coral reefs. Farther south in Cahuita, divers can find Costa Rica's most beautiful coral reef. The best time to visit is during the dry season from February to April, when visibility is at its best for any kind of diving.

### **COSTA RICAN MUSIC**

Costa Rica's culture, with its diverse mix of African, European and native expressions, has contributed to a variety of musical tastes and trends. For example, Costa Rica's music scene includes an indigenous calypso scene in addition to an increase in a flourishing disco audience mainly in the nightclubs of San José. Besides, as in many other countries in Central America and abroad, American and British rock and roll and pop music are popular among younger people.

Dance-based genres such as "cumbia", "marcado", "merengue", "lambada", "salsa" and "soca" are also popular. Tourists generally stumble across the popular folk dances such as "Botijuela", "Tamborito" and "Cambute". Also, there is a strong African musical influence on Costa Rica's Caribbean coast, where the music is based on complex percussion rhythms such as "Sinkit". The African musical tradition includes genres derived from Afro-Caribbean music such as "rumba", "calypso" and, of course, "reggae".

Throughout Costa Rica as well as in other Central American countries, the "marimba" is a popular instrument. Folk dances include the official national dance called "El Punto Guanacasteco". As a matter of fact, Guanacaste is known as Costa Rica's center of folk music. Traditional songs such as "De la caña se hace el guaro", "Pampa", "Amor de temporada" and "Luna liberiana" are also popular throughout the country.

Costa Rican cuisine is known for being tasty, yet fairly mild, with the high use of fresh fruits and vegetables. The typical food, known as "gallo pinto", consists of rice and black beans which is usually eaten for breakfast.

For lunch, the traditional national dish is called "casado". It again consists of rice and black beans, though this time they are served side by side instead of mixed. It will generally include some type of meat (beef, fish, pork chop or chicken) and a salad to round out the dish. There may also be accompanied with some extras like a fried plantain, a slice of white cheese, and corn tortillas.

The plantain, a larger member of the banana family, is another commonly used fruit and can be served in a variety of ways. Ripe plantains have a sweet flavor, and can be fried in butter or baked in a honey or a sugar-based sauce. Green plantains (unripe plantains) are boiled in soups or can be cooked, mashed into small round cakes and fried to make "patacones".

Other Costa Rican food staples include corn tortillas, white cheese and picadillos. Tortillas are used to accompany most meals. Ticos often fill them with whatever they are eating. "Picadillos" are meat and vegetable combinations where one or more vegetables are diced, mixed with beef and garnished with spices. Common vegetables used in "picadillos" are potatoes, green beans, squash, ayote, chayote and arracache.

#### HOW TO USE CHOPSTICKS

Many visitors to Asian countries, such as China and Japan, are fascinated when they see a small child, of perhaps just two years old, eating with a pair of oversized chopsticks. In no time at all, the contents of the bowl are transferred piece by piece to the child's mouth. It really looks easy.

Would you like to try using a pair of the "quick ones"? With a little practice, it becomes easy and the chopsticks become like an extension of your hand. Chopsticks are held in one hand only, usually the right one. First, cup your hand with your thumb apart from your fingers. Place one chopstick between your thumb and fingers, resting it against the base of your index finger and the tip of your ring finger. Then, place the second chopstick parallel to the first, and hold it with your thumb and index finger as you would hold a pencil. Make the ends even by tapping them on the food.

May 15: Costa Ricans celebrate San Isidro Labrador Day. Every town with the same name honors this patron saint of farmers and farm animals with a blessing of animals and crops.

June 17: Carrera de San Juan, which is one of the biggest cross-country races, with runners covering a tough 22.5 km course.

July 16: The Day of the Virgin of the Sea is celebrated in Puntarenas. A colorful regatta of decorated fishing boats and yachts in the Gulf of Nicoya salute Puntarenas' patron saint, the Virgin of Mount Carmel. Masses, parades, concerts, dances, and fireworks are some of the activities during this celebration.

<u>July 25</u>: The Annexation of Nicoya Day is celebrated to recognize the decision to join that piece of land to Costa Rica in 1824. Fiestas in Liberia such as folk dances, parades, cattle shows and concerts are the main activities during the celebration.

## EARNING DESIRABLE BLUE FLAGS



On International Water Day, Costa Rica gave its Blue Flag awards to beaches, businesses, conservation areas and other organizations demonstrating a commitment to protect the country's natural resources. "Costa Ricans decided to have a social pact with nature, and that is what we are fulfilling today", said the country's

President at the Blue Flag awards ceremony.

The President also signed a new law to protect the country's hydrological resources. In the 90's, the National Water Laboratory began promoting development in local communities with projects towards the conservation and protection of natural resources as a goal. In 2011, some organizations participated in the Blue Flag awards in seven categories, including the protection of beaches, community development, educational centers and protected areas. The initiative also sought to mitigate the effects of climate change.

Beaches such as Punta del Madero, Playa Blanca, Bahía Junquillal and Manuel Antonio National Park on the Pacific coast were the beaches that received Blue Flag awards. The Environmental Minister recognized the valuable dedication of organizations, saying the steps they had taken to reduce their environmental impacts were not easy. The Minister also made public the plans of creating a national watershed registry with sensors capable of monitoring changes in hydrological resources in real time.






#### **SYPHILIS**

It is a sexually transmitted infection caused by the spirochete bacterium. The primary route of transmission is through sexual contact, but it may also be transmitted from mother to fetus during pregnancy or at birth, resulting in congenital syphilis.

The signs and symptoms of syphilis vary depending on which of the four phases it presents during primary, secondary, latent and tertiary. The primary stage classically presents with a single <u>chancre</u> (firm, painless, non-itchy skin ulceration) in the genital zone, secondary syphilis with a diffuse rash which frequently involves the palms of the hands and soles of the feet, latent syphilis with little to no symptoms, and tertiary syphilis with neurological or cardiac symptoms.



Diagnosis is usually via blood tests; however, the bacteria can also be detected using dark field microscopy. Syphilis can be effectively treated with antibiotics.

Syphilis is believed to have infected 12 million men and women worldwide, but the disease has dramatically decreased since the widespread availability of penicillin in the 1940's.

# CHILDREN ELECTIONS IN COSTA RICA

During the last elections, families lined up around the block at the National Stadium as well as at the National Children's Museum in San José, for the children's elections organized by the Supreme Elections Tribunal. Children from 2 to 15 years of age could vote and learn about the crucial value of democratic elections by casting their votes. Although the results had no official significance, just like the adults, kids were required to present their identification before voting and then cast their votes via an iPad, a common gadget used nowadays by children. So, they didn't require any paper ballot or indelible ink as it used to be in the past.

More than 7,000 children cast their allegoric votes, which were mostly aligned with the way their parents voted. Once each child voted, they received a "Yes I voted" sticker from a Costa Rican scout. For some



children, this was their second time voting. Observers from the Organization of American States (OAS) were certainly pleased to see this educational activity which preserves and keeps alive the value of democracy. They also remarked that Costa Rica is one of the few nations that hold such an event.

## THE NATIVES OF COSTA RICA

Costa Rica is one of the most racially homogenous countries in Latin America. When the Spaniards came, they didn't encounter the great native empires that they did in Mexico or in Peru. Instead, they found several tribes that were fragmentary and culturally diverse. Today, there are eight native groups in Costa Rica and twenty-two reserves. On December 1977, the government passed a law which established the native reserves. It gave national natives the right to stay in self-governed communities, but at the same time, the government withheld the land titles. However, the persecution of natives isn't as marked as it is in other countries of the region. Even though the overall picture doesn't look too bright for the Costa Rican native population, there have been several improvements in recent years that promise to defend their rights. Although only 1% of the country's population is considered of aboriginal



blood, most Costa Ricans are a mixture of European, Indian and Black blood. There are several cultural traits like food, music, dance and religion, which have influenced and penetrated the mainstream culture; thus, the native culture lives on, maybe not in its purest form, but certainly in a diluted version of it.

## TOO MUCH TV MAY RESULT IN ACADEMIC FAILURE



Teenagers who watch several hours of television a day do worse at school and are less likely to graduate than their peers, a new study suggests. The 20-year study found that those watching more than three hours of TV a day were half as likely to

continue their education past high school. In the mid-1980s, scientists began interviewing 14-year-old children from 678 families about their television habits. They also asked the teens' parents as to whether the youngsters had any behavioral or academic difficulties. The researchers continued collecting information from the parents and interviewed the teens again at age 16, and again at ages 22 and 33. The scientists found that 30% of students who watched more than three hours of television at age 14 had attention problems in subsequent years, and fell behind or failed to graduate by age 22. Other experts, however, say the link is unclear and maintain that the study does not provide strong evidence of a causal relationship between television habit and subsequent attention difficulties. Teens whose learning disorders might simply be more likely to watch a lot of TV because they find activities such as reading textbooks very challenging.
