

Adverbs of frequency

We use some adverbs to describe how frequently we do an activity.

Los adverbios de frecuencia expresan la periodicidad con la que se realiza una acción. Se escriben antes del verbo principal de una oración, excepto cuando el verbo principal es el verbo to be

Inglés	Español
Always	Siempre
Usually	Usualmente
Often	Frecuentemente
Sometimes	A veces
Seldom	Rara vez
Never	Nunca
Everyday	Todos los días

Position (posición)

- before the main verb (antes del verbo principal)
- after the verb be (después del verbo ser)
- between the auxiliary verb and the main verb (entre el verbo auxiliar y principal)

A. Put the adverb of frequency on the right place.

1. He **plays** golf on Sundays. (sometimes)
 - He sometimes plays golf on Sundays.
2. The weather **is** bad in November. (always)
 - The weather is always bad in November.
3. It **rains** in California. (never)
 - It never rains in California.
4. We **have** fish for dinner. (seldom)
 - We seldom have fish for dinner.
5. She **will see** him. (rarely)
 - She will rarely see him.
6. Peter **dosen't get** up before seven. (usually)
 - Peter dosen't usually get up before seven.
7. They **do not play** tennis on Sundays. (always)
 - They do not always play tennis on Sundays.
8. Mary **watches** TV. (hardly / ever)
 - Mary hardly ever watches TV.
9. I **go** to school by bus. (always)
 - I always go to school by bus.
10. I **get** up at seven. (usually)
 - I usually get up at seven.
11. I **watch** TV in the evening. (often / frequently)

- I often watch TV in the evening.
- I frequently watch TV in the evening.
