Jason Torres is a young Costa Rican athlete who lives in Jacó. He has practiced surfing since he was a little boy. He has competed on special-colorful surfboards with high waves in the Pacific and Atlantic oceans of Costa Rica including Manuel Antonio, Dominical, Playa Bonita and Jacó. Winning the last competition in Jacó gave him the opportunity to go to Peru where he became the first *Tico* acknowledged as champion of the Pan-American Surf Games in the junior category (under 18).



Jason attributed part of his success to the national team's support. He also said, "What I achieved is something incredible because there's only one champ. Thank God, I had success during some of the hardest moments of the competition." He added, "Truly I felt good vibrations from my partners".

The tournament, where 200 surfers competed, was held in Punta Rocas, 40 kilometers south of the city of Lima, Peru. There were also women in the competition. In fact, our representative from Garabito, who was 4th in the finals, was Lisbeth Vindas.

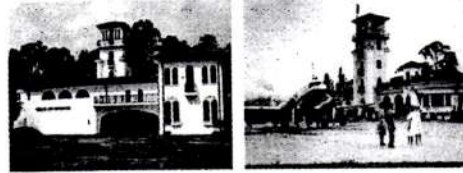

THE COSTA RICAN ART MUSEUM

The Costa Rican Art Museum (MAC due to its letters in Spanish), located in La Sabana Metropolitan Park, was originally the terminal of the first international airport built in 1940; and it was known as La Sabana Airport.



The MAC was created under Law # 6091 on October 7, 1977. It was opened to the public on May 3, 1978. The original purpose of the creation of the MAC was to facilitate opportunities for new artists in the country. In addition, the MAC has promoted research and criticism of artistic production in Costa Rica. In fact, the main objectives of the MAC are to conserve, rescue, promote and stimulate different artistic expressions in the country.

The MAC offers different programs such as Spaces, Shapes and Sounds which is a place dedicated to the introduction of fine arts, as well as *La Casa del Artista* which promotes new artists. In addition, the museum supports those new artists by means of the National Gallery of Contemporary Art, located in the National Library.

The Costa Rican Art Museum exhibits art by national artists such as Francisco Zúñiga (sculptor), Enrique González (painter) and others. In these exhibitions, visitors can find pieces from the 19th century to the present. The museum also organizes at least four exhibitions a year with international artists. Two of them have been Nemesio Antúnez and Santiago Páramo.

COSTA RICAN FOOD

Talking about Costa Rican meals, one would certainly have to pay attention to black beans and rice. This simple standard dish, often referred to as typical food, is the main backbone of Costa Rican cuisine.

Although Costa Rican dishes are still prepared in oil and high in saturated fats, typical food is generally quite healthy. Often served with a good portion of vegetables or fruit, meals are very well rounded and generally high in fiber.



Other factors concerning Ticos' healthy mealtime routines are their eating habits which are very different than in the USA. First, most Ticos do not eat in excess. Their modest portions are much like Europeans and smaller than in other countries. Second, Ticos make lunch the main meal of the day and eat much lighter in the morning and at night.

SAINT GEORGE'S DAY

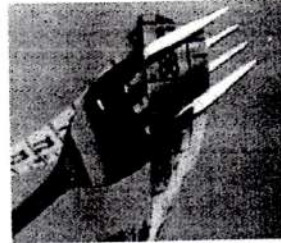

AN EATING DISORDER

Anorexia is defined as an eating disorder. People suffering from anorexia decide not to eat and starve themselves. According to some studies, anorexia mainly affects adolescent girls, although some boys are also affected. Anorexic individuals have extreme weight loss. This weight loss is usually 15% below the person's normal body weight. People with anorexia are very skinny, but they are convinced they are overweight.



Anorexic people often develop strange eating habits such as refusing to eat in front of other people even if they prepare big meals. They use some common techniques to lose weight. For example, they do excessive exercise or intake laxatives because they have the fear of becoming fat. There are many symptoms of anorexia; some individuals may not experience all of them. Some symptoms are the following: anxiety, weakness, shortness of breath, not wanting or refusing to eat in public and body weight inconsistent with age, build and height.

The disorder is thought to be more common among people of higher socioeconomic classes and people involved in activities where thinness is especially looked favorably upon, such as dancing, theater, modeling and distance running. There are many medical risks associated with anorexia. They include shrunken bones, mineral loss, low body temperature, an irregular heartbeat, permanent failure of normal growth, development of osteoporosis and bulimia nervosa. Continued use of laxatives is harmful to the body. It wears out the bowel muscle and causes it to decrease in function.

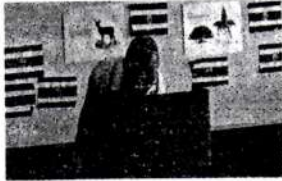

IMPORTANT ASPECTS IN COSTA RICAN ELECTIONS



Costa Rican Elections are held every four years. Traditionally, during elections, voters choose the new President and Congressional representatives. Some positive aspects with the way the Costa Rican Electoral Authorities design the process are the following:

1. **The day of voting:** Elections are always held on Sundays. Most people do not work on that day. So people do not have to coordinate their work schedule, and stand in long lines after the working day.
2. **Automatic registration:** People are automatically registered to vote. All voters just need to present their ID card. Each citizen obtains it when turning 18 years old.
3. **New parties have a place on the ballot:** In some countries with only two major political parties, voters don't really have many choices. However, in Costa Rica minority parties have the possibility to present their programs and names and become part of the electoral system.
4. **Second round voting:** To win the presidency, a candidate needs to get over 40% of the votes in the first round, if none of the candidates have achieved more than 40%, the top two candidates will face a second round of voting.

BENEFITS WHEN LIVING IN COSTA RICA

Retiring in Costa Rica secures many benefits and ways of life. One good thing about retirement in Costa Rica is the quality and affordability of domestic services. Maids, cooks, gardeners, childcare workers or property caretakers are cheap. For example, a maid mops floors, washes windows and dusts. She also cleans bathrooms and kitchens all in about five hours and for a very small pay. They are also well-educated, polite and hardworking. For many disabled, or physically challenged retirees, a reliable, honest and hard-working maid is a must.



Other benefits when living in Costa Rica are related to comprehensive health insurance through the social security system (CCSS) which provides health care as well as a pension. Moreover, all Costa Rican workers and even immigrants are covered by labor laws. They are also protected by compensation programs offered by the National Insurance Institute (INS) to cover injuries on the job. Vacation pay, paid holidays and sick pay, severance pay, maternity leave and Christmas bonuses (the equivalent of a month's salary) are all mandated by law, as well as minimum wage.

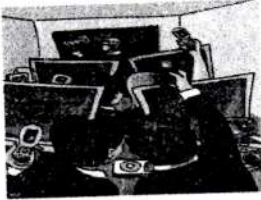

THE IMPACT OF TECHNOLOGY



Technology has positive and negative effects on people of different ages and fields. For example, it can be used at home (as a tool for household chores), in the educational field (finding a huge amount of information to do school work), for entertainment (watching videos, listening to music, chatting, playing games which develop competition), among others.

However, there are some negative effects of technology. For instance, some students may become addicted to video games and not worry about their studies and school performance. There are also health problems such as back pain and weak eyesight due to the high use of technology. In addition, obesity is becoming a big problem especially in little children because they participate in less physical activities. Another negative effect is that people may not spend enough time with their family members and others because they prefer connecting with them by text messaging or chatting, more than meeting them face to face. This behavior may affect their social relationships to a high degree.

Writing skills in children are also being affected because many children do not care about spelling, punctuation and grammar as in the past. Its main consequence, therefore, is poor writing. Finally, children are using the Internet without adult and/or parental controls. This lack of supervision sometimes means children are using it in an inappropriate way. A possible solution might be limiting and controlling access to technology in a child's life.

Traditionally, Costa Rican people demonstrate particular traits. For example, most Ticos are extremely respectful and like to be polite. GETTING OLDER

According to the United Nations, the median age of all countries is due to rise from the age of 29 to 38 by 2050. Just under 11% of the world's population is currently over 60. This will rise to 22% on a global scale and 33% in developed countries by 2050. There are two main reasons for this change. First, people are living longer than ever before. In 1900, the average life expectancy for the world as a whole was 30 years old and in rich or developed countries it was 50. The figures are now 50 years and 70 years, respectively. This in itself is great news, a triumph for nutrition, hygiene and more access to medicine, but people living longer is resulting in an older overall population.

Therefore, a deep concern today is how to support an aging population, which poses a huge challenge on public finances. For example, those countries that offer old-age pensions and generous health benefits for the elderly will have to pay a lot more in the future, or offer lower quality services. Both of these will be difficult to introduce since pensioners will become an increasingly powerful voting force during elections as their numbers increase.

Experts claim that one of the main strategies being used nowadays by governments is to increase the number of older people staying in the workforce after traditional retirement. The age requirement for government funded pensioners has been increasing. However, the most likely approach by future governments is to provide incentives to keep people working rather than to force them to retire.

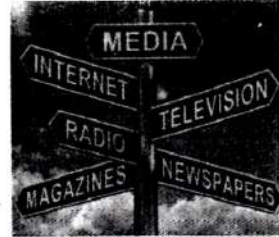

The fact remains that Costa Ricans like reading and knowing what is going on. It is very common to see crowded bus stops and cafés with people reading different newspapers. As a matter of fact, just about on every street corner there is a newspaper stand.



Many press groups, like "Reporters Without Borders", describe the country's media as "fairly free". Much of the daily news covers world and local news, tourism, sports, government, crime, current events, agriculture, boating, retirement issues, the weather and travel. Newspapers like *The Tico Times* and *AM Costa Rica* have an extensive archive of past articles and photographs. *Costa Rica Hoy* has newswire services of special events, labor, the news, technology, political events, and articles of importance like ecology and unions.

There are weekly financial news publications in the Costa Rican market. Some of them are reporting technology, stock reports, business news, public news, blogs and general analysis.
