COSTA RICAN ATHLETES HONORED



The stamps of Hanna Gabriels, (a boxer) Bryan Ruiz (a soccer player), Nery Brenes (a sprinter) and Andrey Amador (a cyclist) will travel around Costa Rica and the world. These four successful Costa Rican athletes are the

protagonists of the new issue of stamps promoted by the Costa Rican Postal Service "Atletas Destacados" which recognizes the discipline, dedication, and courage of them in the consolidation of national sports. These special stamps constitute an amount of 60,000 (15,000 for each of the four athletes). The president of the Costa Rican Postal Service, Álvaro Rodríguez, stressed that this action is a tribute to those Costa Ricans who with their performances in each of the four sports have brought the name of Costa Rica to the world. "Each athlete honored in this issue is an example for the next generation of athletes who can inspire on them and have a motivation to keep going." "These athletes, have given Costa Ricans joy and smiles, but mostly their sporting exploits have become role models for children and young people," said Rodríguez. The issue will be available at window 10 of the Central Post Office or in the Virtual Store with face values between ¢200 and ¢330 colones.

Costa Rica seems to be less internationally profiled in relation to its literature and art. However, it has a rich literature and art heritage to be explored. Some of the most important artists are Manuel Argüello, Joaquín Gutiérrez, Enrique Echandi and Fadrique Gutiérrez.

For example, Manuel Argüello wrote La Trinchera, a historical book which portrays his uncle's (Juan Rafael Mora Porras) campaign against William Walker's forces as

well as other types of writing genres. He also founded the weekly newspaper La Reforma.

Joaquin Gutiérrez, who was a novelist and a journalist, wrote Cocori which has been translated into 11 languages. Gutiérrez also translated a great number of Shakespearean works into Spanish. He also published six novels and a selection of poetry.

Enrique Echandi, a painter who studied in Germany, sponsored art through his renowned art evenings. Another renowned Costa Rican painter is Fadrique Gutiérrez, sculptor and architect who studied under the guidance of the Italian sculptor, Francesco Fortino, and the French painter, Achiles Bigot. He also majored in philosophy at Santo Tomás University. Fadrique Gutiérrez became known for his stone and wood sculptures; in fact, he was the designer of El Fortín Tower in Heredia.

COSTA RICAN COFFEE



Costa Rican coffee has been recognized as one of the world's finest. However, it is not native to Costa Rica, The aromatic product was introduced to the country when seeds were brought over by the Spanish from Africa and the Middle East in 1808.

The temperate climate and fruitful volcanic soil of the Central Valley proved to be the perfect environment for coffee's infant stages in the Costa Rican land. Thus, coffee became the country's main export. Nevertheless, an interruption in the powerful reign of coffee occurred when bananas overtook the export market in 1878. The United Fruit Company arrived on the scene and took advantage of the abundance of bananas in Costa Rica.

The best coffee in Costa Rica is said to come from the Central Valley, but great coffee can be found in Cartago, too. Harvesting takes place from December to February. The reddest beans are hand-picked and taken to a receiver who pays the coffee pickers. From there, the berries are taken to a mill, where they are washed, sun-dried, filtered and separated. Then, the product is roasted and distributed.

SAN JOSÉ CELEBRATES ITS BICENTENNIAL



San José, the capital of Costa Rica, celebrated its 201st anniversary as a city with different activities. They included music, photos, and a review of its history. This celebration began when the name "Villa Nueva de la Boca del Monte de San José" was changed to San José on October 18, 1813.

The festivity took place in the heart of the capital, and included the unveiling of a glass mosaic with the image of the first chapel built in the city in 1737, called "San José de Nazaret". The "Josephites" enjoyed a parade with music and masquerades that guided the crowds from Central Avenue to Morazán Park. In addition, a symposium was organized with prominent local writers, and the participation of the architect-historian Andrés Fernández who has specialized in the history of this city.

The party continued with a "Serenade in the Rain" in the Temple of Music, organized by civil society groups which were engaged in organizing cultural activities in the capital. During the free concert, locals were serenaded by the Concert Band of San José. As the band was singing happy birthday to the city, pieces of cake were given to the attendees.

AQUATIC RESOURCES



Vast water bodies and a large amount of flowing water support the life of aquatic species. Marine life in oceans, occupying two-thirds of the global area, has naturally harbored a large wealth of aquatic plants and animals which are being exploited under the category of aquatic resources.

The diversity of life is so vast, and ecologically sustainable systems are so many in the ocean that knowledge of these life forms has grown into a separate branch of science. While plants and animals living in oceans are known as marine resources, the ones living in flowing water such as rivers as well as inland standing water (reservoirs and ponds) are called aquatic resources.

Apart from the vast resource of plants and animals, a large mineral wealth is also found under oceans. Thus, the extraction of common salt and the shells of mollusks are sources of calcium. Besides that, it is estimated that fish and other aquatic marine products contribute to around 1% of the gross domestic product. As a matter of fact, fish has a significant nutritional value; as a result, a lot of people have taken up eating fish. Nowadays, many people have relied on fisheries for their living.

COSTA RICAN TOURISM DIVERSIFIES



Among all the countries in Central America, Costa Rica has the highest number of tourist arrivals. According to the Travel and Tourism Competitive Index (TTCI), Costa Rica ranked tirst in tourism competitiveness in Central America, second overall among Latin American countries. However, while international tourist arrivals continue growing lately, the Costa Rican sector has been slowed by the

recent global financial crises and the Turrialba Vocano's eruptions. Unlike Mexico or Guatemala, Costa Rica does not have ancient ruins that act as instant cultural tourist attractions; so tour operators are creating Costa Rican cultural tours. For example, some special tours are the following:

<u>Chocolate Tours</u>: Some tours show the history and techniques for making chocolate, while other tours have participants who actually make their own chocolate.

<u>Coffee Tours</u>: These are a mixture of a history lesson, cultural and agricultural tour. Most tours include a visit to the fields where coffee is grown and harvested.

<u>Cooking Classes</u>: Often a Costa Rican luxury hotel's executive chef will teach the classes. It is an excellent way for a hotel operator to take advantage of an asset already on site.

HEALTH RISKS DUE TO OBESITY

Obesity can be defined as overeating. This happens when the quantities of calories people eat exceed the amount of calories they can burn off. The body stores these calories as fat. This fat usually builds up mostly around the stomach or around the hips. Therefore, people's waist size affects the risk of health problems. Besides overeating, other factors associated with obesity are some medications, the lack of sleep, genetic factors and disorders, sedentary lifestyle, binging, hypothyroidism, among others.

As a result, obese people with unhealthy eating habits or a lack of activity may have a higher risk of getting different diseases. For example, they may suffer from type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol and triglycerides, coronary artery disease (CAD), a stroke, sleep apnea, among others. On the contrary, if people have healthier habits or lose weight, their risk for these conditions is reduced.

Some recommendations would be as follows:

- Visit the doctor to make sure the obesity problem is not a genetic problem.
- Ask the physician what physical activity is recommended in order to plan a routine and start exercising.
- Consult nutritionists and follow their advice such as having a balanced diet (if necessary) and exercise.

It is important for obese people to go little by little, and eventually, they will see the results.

THE SUPREME ELECTORAL TRIBUNAL



The Supreme Electoral Tribunal (TSE) has power to organize, implement and supervise all presidential, legislative and local elections. Its main powers and functions are related to

registering political parties in accordance with the provisions of the National Constitution and the Electoral Act. It also monitors the organization and operation of the political parties, including their finances. Besides, it arranges and conducts the registration of the voters. The constitution gives the TSE constitutional power as well as legislative power. There is no possible appeal against the decisions and resolutions of the TSE. This is a remarkable and important attribute because no one can contest the results of an election in court.

During the election campaign, which lasts three months, the TSE assumes direct control of the Civil Guard (part of the domestic security forces). In this way, elections are fully guaranteed to be free of any interference from political authorities. The Congress (Legislative Assembly) cannot enact any law without consulting the TSE in advance on every proposal for legislation regarding electoral matters.

EMPLOYMENT IN COSTA RICA



There are different agencies that help recruit foreign and national people for jobs in Costa Rica. Besides, starting one's own business is very easy because there are a few restrictions with self-employed foreign residents. Foreigners must do one

of two things to be able to work in Costa Rica. First, they can get a work permit through their employer, or second, they can apply for residency. Foreigners must remember that the work permit must be renewed every year.

In Costa Rica, the average worker only makes \$300 to \$500 a month; however, a worker can find jobs through multinational companies which usually offer better salaries starting at \$2,000 per month when applying for upper management positions.



MOBILE PHONES



In addition to the standard voice function of a telephone, current mobile phones may support many additional services, apps and accessories, such as SMS for text messaging, e-mail, access to the Internet, java gaming, Bluetooth, infrared, camera with video recorder and MMS for sending and receiving photos and video.

Most current mobile phones connect to a cellular network of base stations (cell sites). This network is in turn interconnected to the public switched telephone network (PSTN). However, this does not occur with satellite phones. Since 2000, an increasing number of cell phones can connect to the Internet. Thus, users can surf the net by using their cell phones.

ANGELA YVONNE DAVIS



Angela Yvonne Davis was born on January 26, 1944 in Birmingham, Alabama. She is an American organizer and professor who was associated with the Black Panther Party (BPP) and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). She first achieved

nationwide fame when she was linked to the murder of Judge Harold Haley during an attempted Black Panther prison break; she escaped underground and was the subject of an intense manhunt (an organized search for somebody). She is currently a Professor of the History of Consciousness at the University of California and Presidential Chair at the University of California, in Santa Cruz. She works for racial and gender equality and for prison abolition. She is a popular public speaker, nationally and internationally. She is also recognize as a renowned speaker in Europe. Davis is a founder of the anti-prison organization in the United States called Critical Resistance.

THE GROWING IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL MEDIA



A CWJobs survey of job seekers has shown that they're turning to the Internet to find jobs. That means that the social media is becoming increasingly important for jobseekers and recruiters alike. The Internet has become the main source for jobseekers, but employers and recruiters may not be taking advantage of it. Thanks to

the economic crash and the effect on information are still relatively hard to come by.

Then, workers are turning to the web, with its high volume and fast turnover, to track the latest opportunities. Around 70% of respondents use generalist job sites on the Internet with lots of different vacancies. Around half of all candidates look for job opportunities specifically on a potential employer website, while just under half of them go to specialist industry websites to find their next appointment.

While some companies are certainly making strides in optimizing their social media strategy, there's a long way to go before people realize the significance of sites like Twitter, Facebook and LinkedIn.
