Her plan is to become a reconstructive plastic surgeon, so she can travel around the world helping people and practicing her favorite sport, too. Valeria is so proud because she has successfully learned SUP (StandUp paddleboard) in two years.

Currently well-known in Costa Rica, Valeria Salustri caught the attention of SUPConnect magazine (earlier during 2017) who nominated her as the youngster Grom of the Year in 2017. Valeria got a lot of votes. Most of those votes were from her supportive country where she won. That award, which came from California, will stay in her bedroom next to the others already on display.

Salustri was able to travel to Peru to participate in the Panamerican Games earlier last year. She represented Costa Rica by coming in 2nd place in the juniors division of the SUP race, although a penalty bumped her down one spot to 3rd. "Surfing is a beautiful sport, but with SUP you do not have to fight for waves. If you get 1st in a race, it is because you crossed the finish line 1st, and it is not because someone judged your wave riding", she mentioned.

COSTA RICA: RICH IN CULTURE AND ART

Costa Rica seems to be less internationally profiled in relation to its literature and art. However, it has a rich literature and art heritage to be explored. Some of the most important artists are Enrique Manuel Argüello, Joaquín Gutiérrez and Fadrique Gutiérrez. For example, Manuel Argüello wrote *La Trinchera*, a historical book which portrays his uncle's (Juan Rafael Mora Porras) campaign against William Walker's forces as well as other types of writing genres. He also founded the weekly newspaper, La Reforma.

In addition, Joaquín Gutiérrez, who was a novelist and a journalist, wrote *Cocorí* which has been translated into 11 languages. Gutiérrez also translated a great number of Shakespearean works into Spanish. He also published six novels and a selection of poetry. Enrique Echandi, a famous painter who studied in Germany sponsored art through his renowned art evenings.

Another renowned Costa Rican painter is Fadrique Gutiérrez, a sculptor and architect, who studied under the guidance of the Italian sculptor, Francesco Fortino, and the French painter, Achiles Bigot. He also majored in philosophy at Santo Tomás University. Fadrique Gutiérrez became known for his stone and wood sculptures. He was the designer of El Fortín Tower in Heredia.

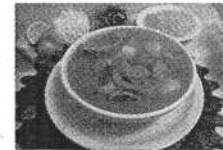

WHAT TO EAT IN COSTA RICA

Costa Rican cuisine is varied, and it has different options for people to try at different places. Here are some options:

- Appetizers: They are served in most restaurants. Appetizers are very inexpensive because they are kind of small dishes. Some of them include *tortillas* piled with meat, chicken, cheese or beans; a marinated seafood salad called *ceviche*; stuffed cornmeal patties wrapped and steamed inside banana leaves (*tamales*), fried green plantain chips with beans and fried cassava.
- Snacks: They are available at small restaurants called *sodas*. Some of them are the popular *tacos*. They are meat in small rolls of *tortilla* with a bit of cabbage. Other types of snacks are *arreglados*. They are little meat-filled sandwiches. A *torta* is another option. It consists of fried ground meat. It can be placed on a *tortilla* with cabbage and tomatoes as a salad.
- Typical dishes: One of them is called *olla de carne*, a bowl of beef broth with large portions of meat, local root vegetables and corn. Roasted chicken is also very popular and is surprisingly tender.
- Seafood: Costa Rica has plenty of seafood. Sea bass (*corvina*) is the most commonly served fish. Red snapper (*pargo*) and tuna appear on some menus. Although Costa Rica is a major exporter of ^{shrimp} and lobster, both are relatively expensive and uncommon on most menus at restaurants.

SAN JOSÉ CELEBRATES ITS BICENTENNIAL



San José, the capital of Costa Rica, celebrated its 201st anniversary as a city with different activities. They included music, photos, and a review of its history. This celebration began when the name “Villa Nueva de la Boca del Monte de San José” was changed to San José on October 18, 1813.

The festivity took place in the heart of the capital and included the unveiling of a glass mosaic with the image of the first chapel built in the city in 1737, called “San José de Nazaret”. The “Joséphites” enjoyed a parade with music and masquerades that guided the crowds from Central Avenue to Morazán Park. In addition, a symposium was organized with prominent local writers, and the participation of the architect-historian Andrés Fernández who has specialized in the history of this city.

The party continued with a “Serenade in the Rain” in the Temple of Music, organized by civil society groups which were engaged in organizing cultural activities in the capital. During the free concert, locals were serenaded by the Concert Band of San José. As the band was singing happy birthday to the city, pieces of cake were given to the attendees.

GLOBAL WARMING PROBLEMS



The biggest threat to life on Earth comes from global warming. For example, rich industrialized countries have been burning fossil fuels such as coal, oil and gas for about 150 years, pumping out vast quantities of carbon dioxide (CO₂) into the atmosphere. CO₂ traps heat from the sun and causes the Earth and the atmosphere to get warmer. This is called the greenhouse effect, and the problem has worsened because of deforestation.

The high level of carbon emissions in the atmosphere lead to climate changes. Thus, the oceans and seas are getting warmer and the polar caps are melting. This causes the levels of the seas to rise, which threatens low coastal regions and islands. Furthermore, the weather is becoming more unpredictable, with severe storms (heavy rains, strong winds, etc.) and floods, and unexpected sea waves and droughts (a long period of weather which is too dry). Another effect of global warming is a rise in the number of endangered species. Many animals and plants could become extinct if their habitat is altered.

The majority of scientists agree that there is an urgent need to cut carbon emissions across the world in order to reduce the effects of global warming. People, across the world, need to develop and use different sources of energy. Some scientists advocate nuclear power, while others stress the importance of renewable energy such as wind, hydro and solar power.

COSTA RICAN TOURISM DIVERSIFIES

Among all the countries in Central America, Costa Rica has the highest number of tourist arrivals. According to the Travel and Tourism Competitive Index (TTCI), Costa Rica ranked first in tourism competitiveness in Central America, and second overall among Latin American countries. However, while international tourist arrivals continue growing, the Costa Rican sector has been slowed down by the recent global financial crises and volcanic eruptions.



Unlike Mexico and Guatemala, Costa Rica does not have ancient ruins that act as instant cultural tourist attractions; so tour operators are creating Costa Rican cultural tours. For example, some special tours are the following:

- Chocolate Tours: Some tours show the history and techniques of making chocolate. Other tours have participants who actually make their own chocolate.
- Coffee Tours: These are a mixture of history, cultural and agricultural tour. Most tours include a visit to the fields where coffee is grown and harvested.
- Cooking Classes: A Costa Rican hotel's executive chef will often teach the classes. It is an excellent way for a hotel operator to take advantage of an asset already on site.

NEW CLASS OF DRUG MAY FIGHT SUPERBUGS



A team of North American researchers has recently announced the discovery of a new class of antibiotics to fight drug-resistant bacteria that threaten public health. The researchers said the new class of antibiotics, called oxadiazoles, was discovered by computer screening and showed a special promise in the treatment of methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA).

They also screened 1.2 million compounds and found that oxadiazole inhibits a penicillin-binding protein, PBP2a, and the biosynthesis of the cell wall that enables MRSA to resist other drugs. MRSA has been a global public-health problem since the 1960s because of its resistance to antibiotics. In the United States alone, 278,000 people are hospitalized and 19,000 die each year from serious infections caused by MRSA.

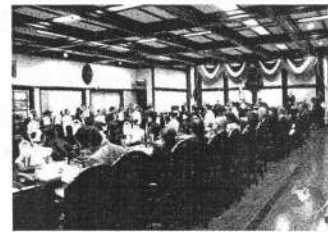

COSTA RICA'S GOVERNMENT

Costa Rica is a democratic republic. Under the 1949 constitution, all citizens are guaranteed equality before the law, the right to own property, the right of petition and assembly, freedom of speech and the right of habeas corpus.

The constitution also divides the government into independent executive, legislative and judicial branches. The executive branch is composed of the president, two vice presidents and a cabinet. The legislative staff is the National Assembly, composed of 57 members. Costa Rica has a very strong system of constitutional checks and balances. Executive responsibilities are conferred in a president, who is the country's center of power. There are also two vice presidents and a 15-member cabinet. The president and 57 Legislative Assembly deputies are elected for a 4-year term.

In April 2003, the Costa Rican Constitutional Court annulled a 1969 constitutional reform which had impeded presidents from running for re-election. As a result, the law reverted back to the 1949 Constitution, which permits ex-presidents to run for re-election after they have been out of office for two presidential terms or eight years. Deputies may run for re-election after sitting out one term, or four years.

EMPLOYMENT IN COSTA RICA

There are different agencies that help recruit foreign and national people for jobs in Costa Rica. Besides, starting one's own business is very easy because there are a few restrictions with self-employed foreign residents.

Currently, foreigners must do one of two things to be able to work in Costa Rica. First, they can get a work permit through their employer, or second, they can apply for residency. Foreigners must remember that the work permit must be renewed every year.



In Costa Rica, the average worker only makes \$300 to \$500 a month; however, a worker can find jobs through multinational companies which usually offer better salaries starting at \$2,000 per month when applying for upper management positions.

A degree in software engineering, computer science or a related field is typically required to become a game developer. MINORITIES WILL BECOME MAJORITIES

Ethnic and racial minorities will be a majority of the U.S. population in a little more than a generation. By 2042, Americans who identify themselves as Hispanic, Black, Asian, American Indian, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander will together outnumber non-Hispanic whites. In fact, the main reason for the accelerating change is higher birthrates among immigrants. So-called minorities will constitute a majority of the nation's children under 18 by 2023 and of working-age Americans by 2039.

Regardless of what people assume about future immigration, U.S. citizens will be more Hispanic and Asian. Projections are likely to generate debates over immigration policy, overpopulation and the changing electorate, and recall earlier eras when the Irish, the Italians and Eastern European Jews were not universally considered as whites. By 2050, about 89 million Americans will be in that group, more than double the number today.

The share of Americans who can identify their roots to immigrants directly from Europe has been decreasing. The new definition of whites is people who have descendants of the original people of Europe, North Africa or the Middle East.
