TEACHING KIDS TO USE SOCIAL NETWORKS SAFETY

Many kids and teens enjoy sharing photos, videos, links, and personal information on social networks with their friends, but they may actually be sharing information with more people than they realize. So, here are some guidelines to help your kids stay safe.



- **Keep your posts private:** On most social networking sites, you can choose to only share things with friends. It's important to use this setting whenever possible because it makes it more difficult for people you don't know to have access to your information.
- **Check your privacy settings frequently:** Some social networks sometimes reorganize their privacy and account settings, which can cause your information to be shared with more people than you want. You should review your privacy settings to make sure they are set the way you want them to be.
- **Be careful with what you share:** Even if you're keeping posts private, it doesn't guarantee that other people won't be able to see it. For example, if you share a photo with your friends, they can easily save it to their computers and post it later. You shouldn't post something unless you're comfortable with everyone seeing it.
- **Don't add strangers to your friends list:** Although it may be tempting to have thousands of "friends" online, this increases the chances that your photos and personal information will be shared with the world.
- **Keep in mind that things you post online may stay there for years:** Even if something doesn't seem embarrassing, it may damage your reputation years later when you're looking for a job or applying to college. Employers and colleges often check social networking sites for information on candidates, so a photo or a post could lower their impression of you.

THE LIFE OF A YOUTUBER

Do funny or interesting things happen to you a lot? Do you think hundreds of thousands of people will want to listen to you tell stories about your life?



That's what life is like for YouTube star, Jessii Vee. More than 150 million people watch her videos of funny stories about herself, and

subscribers to her channel grow every day. Jessii, from Canada, turns her life into her work, six days a week. "I spend all of Sunday having ideas for videos to film that week," says Jessii. "Then, on Monday, I wake up early to start making videos. Usually, a video takes just over an hour to make. I try to make around five, so it takes most of my day. Then, from Tuesday to Friday, I edit them."

My online life isn't all good. In the past, Jessii felt bad when people said negative things about her. "Some people online are so quick to write hate comments. People were negative about things that I can't change. So I decided to love those things and I became more confident in myself," she says.

If you want to start a YouTube channel, there are some things to think about. One thing you might want to do is turn off the comments. Then you won't get any negative ones. Being safe is very important, so don't show your face or real name and don't tell people where you live.

Jessii has some advice about what kind of videos to make. "Be yourself. Don't change to try to make people like you. When I first started YouTube I wanted to look good and do things in ways that people would like. In my old videos, I don't look comfortable because I'm not being myself. But in my videos now, I'm 100 percent myself. I don't care what people think."

BORN TO FIGHT

Malala Yousafzai has been fighting all her life for girls' rights to education. Born in 1997, Malala lived in an area in Pakistan under control by the Taliban. The Taliban believed that only boys should go to school.

At the age of 11, Malala started a blog about her life at school. She wrote that fewer and fewer girls were coming to school because they feared the Taliban. Eventually, the Taliban

completely banned girls from going to school and closed all girls' schools. Both Malala and her father continued to speak out against the Taliban.

In 2012, when Malala was 15, the Taliban tried to kill her. She was injured very badly by a gunshot and went to Britain for medical treatment. By this time Malala had the attention of the whole world. In 2013, only one year after the attempt on her life, Malala gave a speech at the United Nations. She talked about human rights and the right to education for all.

In that same year, she helped to write the book, *I am Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education and Was Shot by the Taliban*. Unfortunately the book was banned in many Pakistani schools.

The following year, in 2014, Malala won the Nobel Peace Prize. At the age of 17, she became the youngest person ever to win that honor. Malala continues to work for women's rights and non-violent protest. She inspires girls around the world to be brave and speak out for what they believe.

A DREAM CAME TRUE

Franklin Chang Díaz was the first Hispanic-American astronaut. The Costa Rican-born physicist completed seven space missions for NASA. Chang Díaz was born on April 5, 1950 in San José, Costa Rica. His father was of Chinese heritage and his mother was Costa Rican. Chang Díaz hoped to become an astronaut and a U.S. citizen, and he grew up to achieve both dreams.

Chang Díaz completed high school in Costa Rica, and left his family at the age of 18 to study in the United States. He enrolled as a senior in Hartford Public High School in Connecticut to learn English. After graduating in 1969, he went on to study mechanical engineering at the University of Connecticut and graduated in 1973. Chang Díaz completed a Doctorate in applied plasma physics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1977.

NASA selected Chang Díaz — one of just 19 other candidates pulled from a pool of 3,000 — to join the space program in 1980. He participated in his first space mission on the *Columbia* in 1996. Chang Díaz traveled into space on six other spaceflights, including on the shuttle *Endeavor*. He space walked to the International Space Station to deliver research equipment to the platform and repair the station's robotic arm in 2002. After logging more than 1600 hours in space, he retired as an astronaut in 2005. He was inducted into the NASA Astronaut Hall of Fame in 2012.



After retiring, Chang Díaz became a space entrepreneur. He founded the company Ad Astra Rocket, which develops space technology known as the VASIMR® plasma engine and has operations in both Texas and Costa Rica. He aims to develop education, science, space, and technology research initiatives in Latin America.

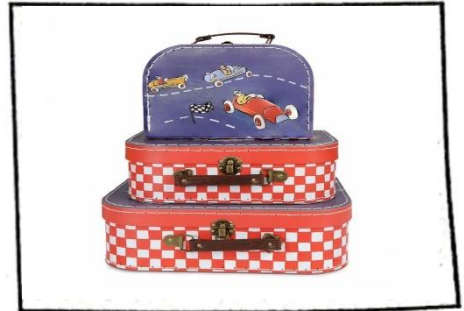

KEEPING YOUR HOME SAFE FOR KIDS

If you have kids at home, sometimes you have to be like teachers and show them some basic things. This information may help you:
