

•Some verbs in English are followed by ing, and others by the infinitive (to + verb).



Let's learn how to use "likewant-would" correctly! We use like + ing to talk about things we enjoy in general.

STRUCTURE:

Subject + like(s) + verb + ing

[Sujeto + like o likes + verbo conjugado con ing]

EXAMPLES:

like playing soccer.


[Sujeto + like + verbo play conjugado con ing]

She likes reading books.

[Subject + like/likes + verb read + ing]







•We use want + to + verb to talk about desires or intentions.

STRUCTURE:

- -Subject + want(s) + to + verb
 - [Sujeto + want o wants + to + verbo sin conjugar]

EXAMPLES:

I want to go to the beach.

[Sujeto + want + to + verbo go sin conjugar]

He wants to study English.

[Subject + wants + to + verb study]

•We use would like + to + verb for polite or formal desires.

STRUCTURE:

·Subject + would like + to + verb

[Sujeto + would like + to + verbo sin conjugar]

EXAMPLES:


I would like to visit London.

[Sujeto + would like + to + verbo visit sin conjugar]

She would like to drink some coffee.

[Subject + would like + to + verb visit]

- WANT TO + VERBO
- EX: I WANT TO SWIM
- DESIRE
