



INTRODUCTION






They are used to express ability, possibility, or permission.

LET'S SEE HOW TO USE THEM!





We use COULD to express:

Past ability

> Polite requests

Possibility

Examples:

I could run fast when I was young. (past ability)
Could you help me, please? (polite request)
It could rain later. (possibility)

CAN

VS

COULD

CAN —— Present or general ability / permission

COULD ---- Past ability / polite request / uncertain possibility

Examples:

I can play the guitar. (now)

I could play when I was a child. (past)

Can you pass the salt? (informal)

Could you pass the salt? (polite)

STRUCTURE

FOR BOTH (AMBOS):

Subject + can/could + base verb sujeto + can/could + verbo sin conjugar

Examples:

She can dance. subject + can + base verb

He could dance when he was a child. subject + could+ base verb (past)

Don't use 'to' after can or could.

Description Example: I can to swim. → WRONG!
